On many occasions going out into "NO MANS' LAND" to attend to, and bring in wounded, and undoubtedly saved many lives. His great personal bravery, cheerful iness and devotion to duty, set the finest possible example to all his fel ow stretcher bearers, and it was mainly through his efforts, that the wounded of his Cox. were all cleared from the battlefield.
